AS (Advanced Subsidiary level) Policy

Abbey College Manchester is a small college with approximately 220 students of whom 100 are studying A-levels. The college has a mix of domestic and international students. Students study three A-levels alongside Success in the Sixth Form, IELTS (if required) and enrichment. Some students study A-levels with football training.

- Students will not sit the reformed AS standalone qualification as it is not compatible with the Year 12 course
- We do not offer the AS stand alone as part of our year 12/13 programmes

- Student potential based on the teacher's overall assessment of performance
